Google Goal/Philosophy

- * **Google's goal:** to digitize the world's collection of books and make them accessible through its advanced keyword search algorithm.
- * **Google philosophy:** The greater the diversity of content on the web, the more useful it becomes. And the more people who can access the information cataloged in books, the more enlightening those works become.

Google Books

What is it?

- * **Google Books** is a service that searches the full text of books that Google has scanned, converted to text using optical character recognition, and stored in its digital database.

Google Books Value to Genealogists

1. Fill in family details
2. Look for context to understand ancestor's family life: **names, places, dates, facts**
3. Books out of copyright and in public domain are available for online viewing and free download in PDF format.
4. Types of materials to look for:
 - * City directories
 - * Family histories of late 1800's – early 1900's
 - * School yearbooks

- * **For public domain or out of copyright books**, or where copyright owner has given permission, Google Books result opens an interface in which the user may view pages from the book. “Full view” and “free for download.”
- * **For in-print books**, Google limits the number of viewable pages through a variety of access limitations and security measures, some based on user-tracking.
- * **For books that may be covered by copyright and where the owner has not been identified**, only "snippets" (two to three lines of text) are shown, though the full text of the book is searchable.

- * Participating publishers can send Google their titles (or upload them as PDF files).
- * Google matches the content to their indexing.
- * Each Google Books result will display the book's title and author, a short excerpt containing the highlighted search terms (snippet), and other public data about the book.
- * Google promotes how to obtain the book by purchase or through a library
- * Books have been submitted by more than 20,000 publishers and authors

- * Google Search is case **insensitive**
- * Use all three versions for name searching:
 - * “first last”
 - * “last, first”
 - * “first * last”
- * OPERATORS:
 - * AND (understood) (Example: john and adams, john adams)
 - * OR (|) (Example: city or town, city | town)
 - * NOT (-) (Example: surname –smith)
 - * + (to require) (Example: James Howe +Ipswich)
 - * ~ (related words)(Example: Place_Name~genealogy) – to make sure the place results have something to do with genealogy
- * **OR Use “Advanced Book Search**

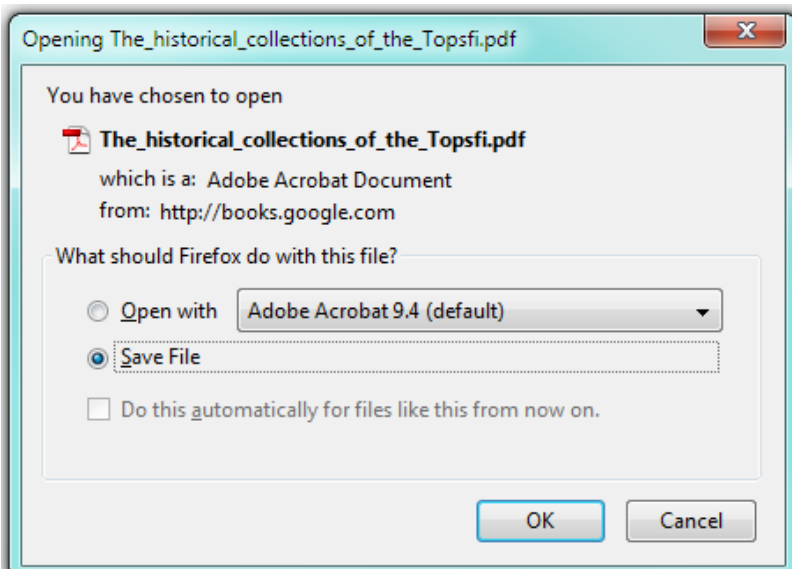
